## Thoughts from the Rear

Early February started off so nice after all the rain, so several of us threw together a plan for a HOT Mid-Winter Cruise to Hadley's Landing. Every thing was looking good and lots of interest, but as the time approached.... "16 degrees"... several folks got cold feet, so to speak, and we are now planning to reschedule to a better time .... "50 plus degrees!"

There is lots of Boat Yard activity as boats are being prepared for the sailing and racing season. Several folks I have talked with are

doing semi-major upgrades and catching up on overdue projects. As I look around, many of these boats have been in the area for a long time, used hard, and some of the rigs need attention. Over the years I have seen lots of masts come down during races and not always in a heavy wind, and have seen many boats retire with parts of the standing rig broken. I have suffered broken parts during races on both WINDMILL and UPSTART. The typical survey goes only to "height of eye," so if your mast is down for the trailer, inspect all the wires for meat hooks, and all the pins and

mounts carefully. If the mast is up, a ride in the bosons chair might be an hour well spent. Also check the chain plates below the deck. I have made repairs on both of my boats below the deck due to loose fasteners.

April 8th will be the OWSA Second Annual Linda Bean Memorial Cruise to St Helens. We leave early in the morning sailing to St Helens for lunch and sail back. We crew our boats with OWSA members and it gives them a chance to spend the day sailing, a sail to a new area for many of them.

Delta Cruise meeting is set for July 29th at Martin Island.
