It's the Little Things

You know, it's the little things that get in the way of success on the race course. Did you ever not look at your turnbuckles for, say, forever and then find out later that one of them had a crack that opened up in a puff which you could have seen had you just looked at them but didn't so you lost the whole rig over the side? Stooges did. It's the little things.

Did you ever forget to put a cotter ring on the shackle holding your shrouds to the chainplate (or have it come out when you hooked it with the fender you were pulling up), and then also lose the rig? Local Motion did and Stooges almost did. It's the little things.

Did you look upriver for Mark 4, not see it for some reason, assume Mark 3 was Mark 4 and round it instead and then eventually have to turn around to unwind the string because you hadn't completed the course? Myst did. It's the little things.

We've all done it. Put the spinnaker up sideways; put the A-sym spinnaker up with the wrong end of the kite attached to the tack; forget to bring your radio, or watch, or course chart, or batteries for your Tack Tic, or any number of essentials; run out of fuel; lose the halyard up the mast; drop a winch handle overboard in a rush; have two 100 foot coiled guys with shackles slide off the deck into the river (that was a spendy one); forget that it's the finish line that's restricted and not the start line and make stupid tactical decisions accordingly, and on and on it goes. I know I've done or been part of all the foregoing examples.

What's the point? It surely isn't that we all make mistakes because we already know that. Rather, it's that irrespective of whether you look at these errors as little or big or simply a normal consequence of racing with a lot of wind, noise, and activity, you have to admit that these lapses add up so that a little error here and another there and pretty soon you're out of phase and playing serious catch up if not completely out of the hunt.

So, what's the answer. Clearly, don't make any mistakes! OK, seriously, the goal is to incrementally make changes in procedure or equipment so that the number and intensity of the mistake/error goes down with each iterative fix or change. If a cleat continues to jam at the wrong time, move it. If the sprit keeps hanging up under load and won't retract, grease it. If you routinely lose track of the course, write it on the bulkhead. Write the word "head" on the top of your spinnaker. Label everything else. Keep spare batteries in your dock box. Put some spare Dyneema on the boat. Check each other out by asking questions of each other to

confirm you all know what is going to happen on the douse or the rounding. Have more than one watch on the boat. The list is endless. But, every little thing counts.

In Formula 1 racing, which I've been glued to this season, a pit stop of 3 seconds verses 2 seconds is the difference between finishing in the money or way down the list. In this last race, Monte Carlo, a driver who was almost guaranteed to have a podium finish had to retire

because they couldn't get a wheel nut off of the spindle during a pit stop tire change. Somehow the nut got cross threaded or the air driver was mis-attached and stripped the nut flange. These are programs that have budgets of hundreds of millions of dollars. They make mistakes, but you can be assured that after the race that air driver and the entire wheel assembly were flown back to the mother ship for a complete engineering review. We live in a different atmosphere from F-1, but the principles as the same. Review the cause of the error and adjust or revise. The overall lesson: everything makes a difference when you're racing. When you take care of the little things, the big things will most likely take care of themselves.
