Delta Cruise: Meet at Martin Island July 28th, and join us for the weekend, week, or any length of time you can spare. At the June SYSCO Meeting we will be talking about the cruise, with a history of the cruise, our float plan (yours could be different), some suggestions on what to expect, and try to answer any questions. This will be our 23rd SYSCO DELTA CRUISE, and of the 11 boats in the SYSCO raft up Memorial Day weekend, all expected to make the trip, and several others have informed us that they intend to join in.

An overview of our float plan is to meet up with the fleet at Martin Island on the 28th. On Sunday the 29th we'll sail/motor to Cathlamet for showers, renew the ice, and do a final provision for three nights rafted at Warren Slough. On the 30th we'll leave Cathlamet for the Islands around noon to pass Horseshoe Island before the 3:45 PM high tide, and raft up in Warren Slough at the ABC Out Station. We will return to Cathlamet on the 2nd leaving Warren Slough early afternoon to pass Horseshoe Island before 5:30 PM. Friday we will return upriver to Martin Island and spend some time there, returning to Portland on Sunday.

Others might chose to modify their float plan to include a side trip to Astoria, Ilwaco, or another stop in the Lower River. Or it could be an early return home or an extended stay. That's what's so great about the Delta Cruise...it's all up to you.

SYSCO Board Meeting Notes

JUNE 4, 2007

Meeting called to order at 6:35 p.m. by Commodore. Officers attending: Rod Dawson, Commodore, and Al Calcagno, Treasurer. Others attending: Frank Bocarde, Program Committee.

No reports from officers.

Rod stated that he will not be at the next General membership meeting on June 18, and possibly the next Board meeting on July 2, due to knee surgery. Al said he will be at the next General meeting and will preside if necessary. Discussed moving the July Board meeting one week later to accommodate, but decided against that due to upcoming SYSCO picnics that week.

The picnics are scheduled for July 10 & 12 at Tomahawk Bay, during/after the last races of the SYSCO Summer series; ALL members are invited. Volunteers are needed! Columbia Crossings provides the gas BBQ and garbage cans; SYSCO provides grub/refreshments. Frank mentioned that we need a special e-mail notification of the picnics sent to all members. Also, handouts announcing the picnics need to be given out by the race committee to all race boats the week before and the evenings of the picnics.

Frank also mentioned that he feels a special e-mail notification of the General meetings needs to be sent out at least a week prior to the scheduled dates, rather than relying on the newsletter. Having the newsletter notification coming out only a couple of days before the meetings is not adequate notification. The Board members present agreed.

Rod mentioned that he has tentatively secured a popular local jazz group for entertainment at the October awards banquet; agreement yet to be finalized.

Discussed using part of the budget surplus from last year, and this year's higher than expected membership income, for subsidizing the ticket price for the banquet to entice more members and crew to attend. Board members present agreed to do this.

Al suggested that someone write an article about Delta Cruise tips and ideas for the next newsletter. Frank mentioned that he would discuss this with Bill Sanborn.

A Different Cruising Perspective

There is a core group of members that enjoy the cruising side of SYSCO. Usually once a month during the boating season they can be found at the East Dock Government Island, Coon Island on Multnomah Channel, Martin Pond just North of St. Helens or other places up and down the river.

Many of our new members are not yet aware that they are more than welcome, in fact encouraged, to join the cruises. Perhaps they don't know what to expect, what to bring or what they are going to do.

Aside from the usual jungle cruises, (dinghy rides up and down narrow and shallow backwaters), hiking, socializing, swimming and playing in the water, invariably someone has an issue they are trying to figure out about their boat. This is where the value of all of the old sailors comes out. There is no lack of ideas on how to handle any given problem.

During the Memorial Day Cruise to Martin Pond, old sailor Flotsam said he was having problems with his roller furling during the trip down river. In no time three of us were taking the thing apart, while two others stood by to make sure we could put it back together. We unscrewed things and used a hacksaw on others. We learned quite a lot about roller furling systems

and almost fixed the problem. We did put it all back together without losing any parts.

I had been wanting for some time to remove an unused topping lift from the top of my mast and I also had a jammed halyard. When I mentioned this one morning, some eyes lit up, others groaned that it would be a fair amount of work to winch my bulk up the spar. As luck would have it, before getting into the cocktail hour much, old sailors 1, 2 and 3 agreed to grind me up. Several others refilled their refreshments and took up seats nearby to make sure all was safe and secure. First stop was the jib halyard block, about three-quarters of the way up. After freeing the jammed halyard, they hoisted me up to the top. It was a little spooky up there since the only support is the backstay, but I went right to work disconnecting the old topping lift. Then it was used to hoist up the camera. Few have the opportunity to see what a cruising raft-up looks like from 50 feet overhead. It's a different cruising perspective.

This core group of old sailors is ready, willing and able to help you out. They will help you dock, anchor, tie up to a raft or help fix a problem. With them there, you don't have to worry about what to do. Just join a SYSCO cruise. The big one is coming up July 28th through August 5th. The first raft-up is in Martin Pond, then down to Cathlamet and beyond. Come on down for the first weekend or join us for the whole week on the delta. It's Delta Cruise Time.
