Some possibilities were brought up and they will be contacted. Jim Shaw has the trophies ordered and there are quite a few more than last year since we had a number of fleets with large entries.

Karen reported that Regattas were changed from two days to one day and the attendance was up this year. That is not necessarily the reason for the increase, but may have played a part. She also stated there were some participants who would like the afterrace BBQ re-instituted for the One Design.

Got Race Captain?

SYSCO is still looking for our 2008 race captain/ vice commodore, and we'd love to be talking to YOU! What does the race captain do, you may ask. The duties include chairing the race committee for SYSCO and coordinating the racing program, as well as serving as the club representative to the Oregon Corinthian Sailing Association. SYSCO hosts four racing events for the 2008 season: Spring Series, Spring Regatta, Summer Series, and the One-Design Regatta. In addition, SYSCO hosts several informal Friday night beer can races.

Five weekly races on either Tuesday or Thursday evening comprise the Spring and Summer Series. Fleets racing on Tuesday evening will provide a race committee for a Thursday evening race and vice versa. The race captain will coordinate the series, with the help of the SYSCO race committee. The Spring Regatta and the One-Design Regatta are only one day; the race captain secures a committee to manage these events, as well as providing committees for the beer can races. The race committee is responsible for logging race entries and that race results are properly posted, and coordinates the protest process.

The race captain works with the SYSCO board and the mark boat board member to ensure that Poncho is operating properly, and that the necessary race equipment is available for scheduled races. Yes, there is a lot to do, but the race committee and fleet captains assiss the race captain so that the responsibilites are spread out and no one is overwhelmed.

It's been a fun two-year stint for me. I've learned a lot and met lots of great people. One thing is for sure, I've asked for a lot of help and always get a positive response from the sailing community.
