With all due respect and apologies to the Beatles, we need someone to be SYSCO Race Captain. Michelle Bennett, who BTW has close to 40 years of volunteering for every kind of flag officer and committee chair in almost every club on the river, has had to step down for personal reasons. It was a difficult choice for her because she never backs down from a challenge, but health and family come first in my book, and I'm sure in yours, where sailboat racing is concerned. She's done a ton of the heavy lifting over the past several months and so whomever steps up to this position will have a significant amount of the pre-season work out of the way. Plus, Gregg Bryden is the rear commodore (previously Race Captain and Commodore), I have held down the Race Captain position for 2 years, and Philip Martindale has been the Thursday night coordinator for 3 years. The support pool is huge.

What is the job? At this point it is primarily ensuring that there is a fully staffed race committee for all the SYSCO races. The Tuesday (Brian Haveman) and Thursday (Philip) coordinators are the first line of communications to the fleets. They coordinate RCs. If for some reason there is a hole in the lineup that they can't coordinate, those needs get bucked up the chain to the Race Captain. There are some other races like the St. Helen's Race and Cruise where the RC finds a couple of people to just start the race or do a more complete race committee on something like the Crew Overboard. But the bulk of the race committee coordination is handled by the Tuesday/Thursday coordinators. There's also race result reporting to Gary Whitney.

The position takes a person who can juggle details and make some contacts either by phone or email. The mark boat is handled by someone else. The scoring by Gary is as noted above. I estimate the time commitment of 1 to 2 hours per week (4+ hours per month) starting mid-April until the first week in September.

SYSCO BOARD MEETING MINUTES March 9, 2023

Zoom meeting 5:30 pm

Commodore's Report:

Communication/Website: Melissa Cearlock is the person responsible for the website. Anna and Melissa consulted on the website and while we may do a major overhaul in the future, it will not happen immediately.

New Mark Boat – Poncho: The new boat has been purchased and the old Poncho is sold, although the deal has not been cash finalized. That is expected shortly. New Poncho needs a name. It is basically the same boat with a bigger engine. The bench seat was changed out for more height to allow for the larger, 20 gallon, fuel tank. The Poncho team has been working on the gear. The target date for launch is the Wed before April 1st. Poncho training will be in April. Michelle requested April 8th. Sloan will check with Scott and the insurance company to make certain we have insurance coverage for the new boat, and not the old.

Race Management Clinic: This went well with 40 people in attendance. It was a 2 hour session led by Dennis with demonstrations by Gregg and Michelle. The PDF of this meeting is already published.

Pray for Wind: Went well, but changes in process and marketing are projected for next year.

Safety at Sea: It is scheduled for March 19th in Vancouver and is currently fully subscribed.

Lifesling Zoom: This is an RCYC and PYC event. Date March 15

Sailing on Sundays – Chili Cook-off: After the last Sailing on Sundays race, March 12. Bill Sanborn is driving the event at PYC.

Crew Overboard (April 1): Michelle is coordinating this race committee.

Treasurer's report: See attached Treasurer's report. There is a 4-6 week lag between when people pay SYSCO dues and when Regatta Network sends us the money. So we will often have an underestimate of our members.

Vice Commodore/Race Captain's Report:

Fleet Captains are partially in place. PHRF still needs a person.

RC Duty will be finalized and posted.

Membership Report- sent out by Carisa earlier, appears below.

"We have 3-4 new members to vote on

- 1. Shancy Holland, full member, Pick Pocket Catalina 22, reports racing and sailing for 20+ years, she is on OWSA board and in charge of Education at OWSA.
- 2. Scott Jones, full member. Ratty, a Ranger 20. 3 years sailing, 1 year racing.
- 3. Jan Steinbock, associate member. Has sailed for 9 years and raced for 7 years. No boat.
- 4. On Your Mark, which is a 501c 3 that owns Wild Women signed up for a SYSCO membership. It lists Karen Anderson's address, and Edie Felix's email address, tho neither of their names appear on the membership. I don't know if this is a problem, or if our bylaws require a person, but I am happy to look into it. We took their money for a full membership. It doesn't look like they have signed up this way before. They need to be voted in, so not sure if you want to do this during the meeting, or get a reading of the bylaws first.

We currently list 62 members. A LOT signed up before the late fee, 20! So that works."

All four were voted upon and approved.
